Community Survey Results

Thank you to our parents and carers who completed our recent survey on school behaviour and management. In total we had 34 responses which has helped inform our future direction and identify key areas for success and improvement.

Feedback shows that parents **strongly agree** with the following statements:

•Staff support an inclusive environment where your child feels known, valued and cared for (raw score average 4.5) •The school has a reputation for positive student behaviour (4.4) •Staff support and encourage positive behaviour with the students (4.4).

Feedback shows that parents **agree** with the following statements:

•Parents feel well-informed about their child's wellbeing including incidents and behaviours (raw score average 3.9) •The introduction of the 'Spirit of Mullaway' is a positive reward initiative (3.7)

•The Executive managed behaviours provides positive intervention to improve at-risk student behaviour (3.6) •The Bee Award system is an appropriate system for student recognition (3.6).

Feedback shows that parents are **neutral** with the following statements:

•The removal of the visual 4-Level System has shown a positive impact on your child/children's wellbeing (raw score average 3.5)

Life Skills Go is a positive program for our Yr 1-6 students (3.5).

The majority of comments in regards to areas for improvement were related to the Bee Award system, particularly in relation to consistency and diversity (i.e. not just for academic achievement).

We are reviewing our Bee Award system to address these concerns, which includes building a stronger stage based monitoring process in 2025. We will also be expanding the criteria for the Spirit of Mullaway, our initiative to replace the 4-Level System, and will keep you updated throughout 2025.

The new School Behaviour Support and Management Plan (SBSMP) will be published on our school website from the start of the 2025 school year.
